Welcome to the updated St. John's Vancouver Youth Parent's Handbook for the 2023/24 year!

Enclosed are dates to help with planning the year ahead as well as top tips and resources to help in our partnership.

Every Wednesday during term time I send out a 'youth update' sharing what we have been up to and what is going on. We also have a monthly prayer letter to help you join us as we give thanks and pray for the youth ministry. Please ensure that you get the weekly update and pass on the information to your youth.

As a parent of 3 (two are still teenagers) I am very aware of the support and partnership that I need to encourage my youth to grow spiritually. 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## 1. Youth Plan

We seek to provide your young person with biblically faithful and age relevant teaching, great fun, friendships, and a vibrant Christian community. We also seek to support and resource you and your whole family as we together teach and train them.

#### 2022–23: A Year in Review

We saw a growth in music ministry and mission opportunities, youth attendance at the evening service grew and our teaching from Jonah and Genesis as well as big questions helped the youth to grow a missional heart and biblical worldview. This year we are hoping to build on this, taking a team overseas to Nepal and focussing on strengthening the work with our Senior Youth.

## This year, please encourage the young people to practice these 5 healthy habits:



Church (regular attendance)

Encourage your youth to commit to church.

Homegroup (Fridays)

Youth Group on Friday evenings.

Outreach (Evangelism)

Sharing the gospel with others.

Ministry (Serving)

Serving the body of Christ on Sundays.

Personal walk
with Jesus
(Daily prayer and Bible reading)

This is the foundation of our friendship with Jesus. There are great resources online for free or to buy that can help in this area.



## 2. Sundays

At the heart of our discipleship is the Sunday morning and evening gatherings at St John's. Friday youth group is great for peer relationships, but Sundays foster multigenerational connections and corporate worship. Although we cater in part to the youth through smaller groups, the collective all age gathering is key in maturing our youth and forming fellowship and meaningful connections with all people. It is an important place for them to see you living out your faith for love for one another.



#### **Sunday Morning**

Junior Youth (grade 7–9) and Senior youth (grade 10–12) join the 10:00 am service and leave after the welcome time to gather in their groups. Junior Youth will have small group bible study three times a month. Senior Youth will gather twice a month and will typically follow the sermon series (see end of the booklet for fall term's teaching program). Senior Youth stay in the service on the first Sunday of the month for holy communion followed by lunch together around people's homes. On the third Sunday there will be a youth service downstairs with band and both groups together. We will be following the 1 Corinthians teaching at the beginning of the year.

#### **Sunday Evening**

Sunday opportunities to lead services and fellowship after the service (7:00–7:45 pm) have encouraged numerical growth. During coffee hour after the service, 10-15 young people gather to reflect on the sermon or a BIG question, play games, have treats, and fellowship.

Please encourage your youth to attend church!

## 3. Fridays

## Fun, Friendship, & Faithful Bible Teaching



On Fridays we see over 50 youth regularly join us from 6.30-8.30pm. Most Fridays we spend time having fun / games and catching up before splitting into small groups with specific leaders. Occasionally we have a BIG night where we feed the youth pizza and have a talk and band, termly we also have 'Chapel', where we join with other youth groups in the city, and other times we have socials and a chance to meet in homes for small groups.

See the back page of this booklet for the program. Friday night will be the primary connection youth have with their own peers.

#### What does a typical Friday look like?

6:00 pm - Leaders' prayer

**6:15 pm –** Registration opens and set-up begins

6:30 pm - FUN

Basketball, volleyball, foosball, table tennis, football, and more. This time could be split by Junior Youth and Senior Youth.

7:15 pm - TOGETHER

Notices, competitions, games, Bible reading, and a sona.

7:30 pm – Bible study in small groups and an activity led by leaders, followed by prayer.

8:30 pm - Finish. Pack down and leave 9:00 pm.

## 4. Tips For Nurturing Faith

## It's A Whole Life Thing...

#### 1. Keep the Conversation Going

As you pray for your young people, keep the conversation going, talk about what they are studying on Fridays at youth group as well as who their friends and connections are. You are not being nosy but interested. Try to stay one step ahead of activities by reading the weekly youth update. Ask how activities went and what is happening next, there is always lots going on.

## 2. Encourage Them to Invite Friends.

Encourage them to see Friday as an opportunity to invite others from school and clubs to come and hear the gospel. We would love for Friday youth to grow in number and welcome new youth from outside our churches, Jesus is great news for everyone and our vibrant community is a great place to come to hear the gospel and meet him. Fridays are a safe place to ask questions and encourage a healthy balance of fun, fellowship, and faithful bible teaching.

#### 3. Connect Them

Sundays are also key to establish a healthy interaction with other ages and a worshipping community. Statistics suggest that many of our children start dropping off in their late teens and early 20's (*Growing Young*, Barna 2019). Those that stay are resilient and have strong connections with multi generations, they also have started to put their faith into action serving and use their gifts in the body of the church.

## 3. Encourage Your Youth to Speak to Their Leaders When They Have Great Questions.

It is helpful for youth to have a community of faith that is nurturing and discipling. Feel free to email us if you need extra support. Get to know their friends and invite them (and their group) around on some of the small group nights where we need a family to host.

# 5. Understanding & Applying the Bible

## Understanding & Applying the Bible

The bible can seem scary and complex for youth (and many adults). There are great resources to help us to see the BIG PICTURE and help us with the context and culture of the Ancient Near East. Mark produces a booklet every term to encourage the youth to read the Bible and to underline, highlight, and make notes. Feel free to use them or make use of complete Bibles. Biblical literacy is something we want to encourage. We particularly want youth to understand how the Bible is a whole revelation of God.

#### The Usefulness of Scripture

Help your youth to see that "all Scripture is living and active, sharper than a double edged sword" (Heb. 4:12) and "useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training us in righteousness so that we are thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16–17)

The Bible Helps Us Learn and Grow in Wisdom With the help of God's Holy Spirit we see how many in the Bible story have walked with God, and many others wandered from God. Each story in the Bible is an opportunity to learn and grow in wisdom.

So encourage your youth to read the Bible! On our retreats, there will be quiet times set apart for youth to practice reading Scripture and praying.
